WHAT'S NEXT AFTER STARTING AN APPLICATION

Ensure you have requested transcripts from all schools where you have received academic credit.

NEXT STEPS FOR ACCEPTED STUDENTS

Submit the \$50 intent to enroll form and **deposit fee**. This assures a place in the next entering class. This fee is non-refundable but is credited to the student's account upon enrollment.
