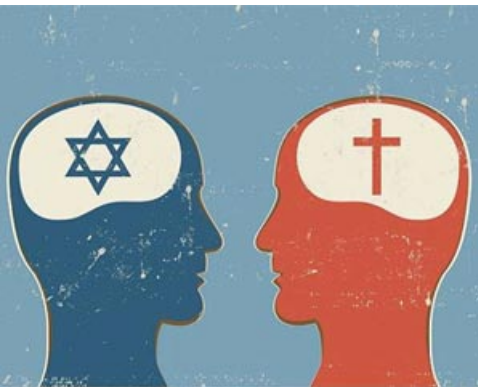


## INTERFAITH WORKSHOP ADDRESSES CHILD ABUSE

Child Sexual Abuse and Neglect” Nov. 5, 2012, from 8:45 a.m.- 3:45 p.m.

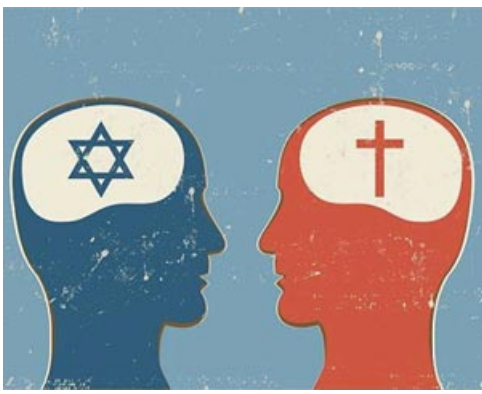
