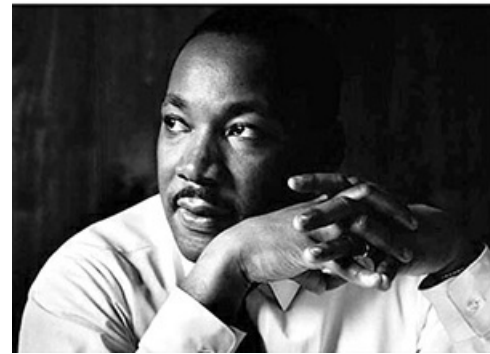


KELSO LECTURE IN HONOR OF MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.

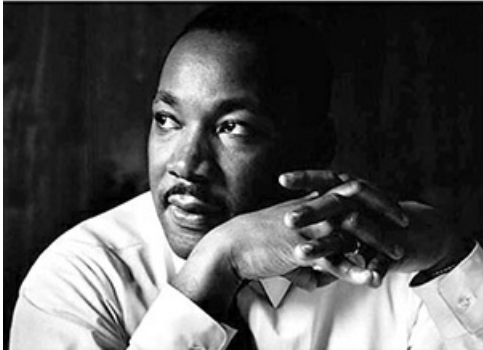
