Within the Focused Track, students can specialize in Scripture and Its Interpretation or Christian Theology and Traditions. At Pittsburgh Seminary, our M.T.S. degree is designed to be both academically rigorous and flexible by offering significant electives throughout the theology curriculum. Students in the M.T.S. program can select the courses that will best benefit their theological research. Additionally, courses are offered in a hybrid format, so classes meet synchronously online and in person twice per semester.
