Carolyn Osiek taught at the graduate level for 32 years, first at the Catholic Theological Union in Chicago and then at Brite Divinity School, Texas Christian University in Fort Worth, where she is the Charles Fischer Professor of New Testament emerita. She holds a doctorate in New Testament and Christian Origins from Harvard University, and is a past president of the Catholic Biblical Association and the Society of Biblical Literature. She is the author of numerous books including: *The Shepherd of Hermas*, *Philippians and Philemon*, *A Woman's Place: House Churches in Earliest Christianity*, co-authored with Margaret MacDonald and Janet Tulloch.
