To investigate ordinary spiritual experiences such as awe, deep inner peace, giving and receiving compassionate love, gratitude for blessings, and their role in daily life, Dr. Lynn Underwood created the Daily Spiritual Experience Scale (DSES). The DSES has been used not only in research in multiple disciplines around the world, but also in multiple settings that provide direct services such as nursing, counseling, clinical, and other psychological services, coaching, hospice, chaplaincy, and ministry.
