Keith's presentation, "**The Newness of the Old**," will begin with the understanding that the Church in North America is in a time of great transition; it no longer holds a position of societal dominance as seen in years past (Christendom), nor is it "The Place" where many Americans go to receive religious instruction or even to worship God. With this reality, congregations can no longer be "cities on the hill" detached from the brokenness and beauty in their communities. Instead, people of faith are *called back* to be a "book of Acts" people, empowered by the Spirit to witness to Jesus to all they encounter in their daily lives. We are



called to envision our communities as mission fields and our local congregations as active missions that bear witness to the Kingdom of God on earth as it is in heaven.
