The Confession of Belhar, adopted by the Dutch Reformed Mission Church in South Africa in 1982, expressed that church's response to the system of apartheid. As a significant confession from the global South, the confession is being considered by at least three Reformed communions, including the Presbyterian Church (USA), for inclusion in their books of confessions. This workshop is designed to give participants the opportunity to learn about Belhar prior to votes in local Presbyteries regarding its adoption by the PC(USA).
