even as we know that your Spirit is on the move in all the world.


Forgive us our presumption







People: Alleluia! Amen.











## Worship Notes

Dutch society has become highly secularized, with a quarter of the population declaring themselves atheist and only a small percentage participating in church life. In such an environment, how do Christian communities function? What have Dutch churches learned about God, themselves, and their neighbors? What would they like to teach us?

On this trip, the team visited church plants and immigrant churches in Amsterdam and Rotterdam, observed how a fourteenth-century city church (from which once the Pilgrims left on their journey to the new world!) has been missionally redeveloped, and stayed overnight with a community in the new monastic tradition in a small 340-people farming community in the Frysian countryside.
