COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This three-credit elective course offers students an opportunity to develop an understanding of biblical exegesis. Students will examine the principles, methods, and tools used in the critical study of the Bible, including form, historical-critical, ideological, narrative, womanist, queer, and other exegetical methods. This course relies heavily upon students' close reading of both scholarly writings and biblical passages to consider how exegetical methods answer particular questions about the Bible, its context, and its audience.

- Discuss key persons, methods, and trends in the exegesis of the Bible
- Apply various exegetical tools to a biblical text
- Reflect upon aspects of their location as an interpreter of the Bible
