### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Lesslie Newbigin (1909-1998) has been called one of the church fathers of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Ordained in the Church of Scotland, he became a missionary in India, was instrumental in the formation of the Church of South India (the result of unification of Presbyterian, Episcopal, Methodist and Congregationalist denominations), in which he served as bishop, was involved with the World Council of Churches as Associate General Secretary and, on retirement in England, served a small Reformed congregation in Birmingham while using his cross-cultural experiences to develop a unique missional perspective on the church in a post-Christian Western society. As we increasingly rethink what it means to be church, this course explores what we can learn from Newbigin's missional theology.

#### **CLASS OBJECTIVES:**

- 1. To help students think through Newbigin's account of the overall narrative and broad theological themes of the Bible.
- 2. To help students think through Newbigin's understanding of key theological themes, and to see how Newbigin's account both develops and functions within particular social contexts and invites to fitting and faithful theological practices.
- 3. To help students use Newbigin's theology to describe a particular context in terms of God's mission.
