COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course explores theories and practices related to providing pastoral care to persons coping with death, loss, grief, and transition. Students will also engage biblical, theological, and spiritual resources as frameworks for understanding the nature and role of transformation within experiences of transition and loss.

CLASS OBJECTIVES:

By the end of this course students will be able to:

- 1. Articulate an understanding of pastoral care that addresses issues of death, loss, grief, and transition as parts of the human experience.
- 2. Describe and evaluate various theological and pastoral approaches to loss and grief.
- 3. Narrate the roles of loss and transition in one's own life and how they have shaped one's identity as a caregiver.
- 4. Demonstrate familiarity with the pastoral skills and practices that help to facilitate transformation in moments of loss or transition.
