COURSE DESCRIPTION:

In this course, students will be introduced to the theology and practice of caring ministry, with special attention to pastoral self-awareness and key relational skills. The course will help students develop their capacity to understand and discern the needs of persons and communities and to determine appropriate responses. Students will also explore the intersection of leadership and care through the study of organizational dynamics and group processes.

CLASS OBJECTIVES:

This course will enable students to

- (1) articulate an understanding of pastoral care as a practice that involves attentive presence, theological reflection, and informed action;
- (2) describe basic principles, theologies, and theories that ground pastoral care;
- (3) evaluate caregiving practices, including their own personal strengths and limitations as caregivers;
- (4) demonstrate a growing competence in the art of pastoral care through skill-building and reflection.
