COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Supralapsarian Christology holds that the incarnation is not contingent upon sin, but central to God's fundamental intentions for creation. The last fifteen years has seen a renaissance of this approach, with a variety of new studies exploring its implications not only for Christology, but also for Biblical studies, ethics, pastoral care, and missiology. In this course we will read some of these contributions, focused on the ways in which supralapsarian Christology offers a fresh way of telling the Biblical narrative in a new missional era.

CLASS OBJECTIVES:

- 1. To help student think through the larger narrative of Scripture in a Christological light.
- 2. To be able to narrate models of supralapsarian Christology, the arguments for and against them, and the impact they have on the way we imagine Christian doctrine and life.
- 3. To develop a convincing account of the Christian story for a new missional era.

PREREQUISITES: None.

REQUIRED TEXTBOOKS/READINGS:

This year several new books on supralapsarian Christology will be published from a variety of disciplinary angles. This course gives students a chance to read these books together, discuss them with the authors over Zoom, and explore their impact for the life of the church. Students are to participate in a Continuing Education Study Day on supralapsarian Christology and the life of the church (November 19) with Sam Wells and Edwin van Driel.
