Hallelujah!





## Worship Notes

Call to Worship

Consider inviting anyone in your congregation who speaks a language other than English to participate in this Call to Worship – each one extending the invitation of verse 1 of the Psalm in his or her own language and responding to the invitation with verse 2. They pass this invitation and response one to another until a leader extends the invitation to the congregation in English.

Language 2:

(facing Language 1 person)

(turning toward Language 3 person)

(facing Language 2 person)

For great is the Lord's steadfast love toward us, and the faithfulness of the Lord endures forever.

(turning toward English-speaking person)

Praise the Lord, all nations! Extol God, all peoples!

English-speaking person:

(facing Language 3 person)

For great is the Lord's steadfast love toward us, and the faithfulness of the Lord endures forever.

(turning toward congregation)

Praise the Lord, all nations! Extol God, all peoples!

(lifting hands in invitation for congregation to respond)

People:

For great is the Lord's steadfast love toward us, and the faithfulness of the Lord endures forever. Praise the Lord!

\*Sermon

The sermon may point to God at work through the Holy Spirit in the midst of the congregation and the surrounding community. Ideally, the sermon will lead seamlessly into the second reading from Acts, "The Promise of Pentecost." This portion invites the congregation to participate in bearing witness to this promise.

\*\*Responding to the Word: Dreams I-III

In this Pentecost celebration it is appropriate to allow space to hear the proclamation of God's manifold works in the voices of different members of the congregation. Consider asking a few congregants (with time to prepare!) to imagine what they think God wants for your church and/or the community surrounding your church. Encourage them to describe with vibrant language where they see God at work in your community and where they see God calling your community. Ask, What can the community look like when the gospel is truly heard and lived in the power of the Holy Spirit? They may wish to share an instance in which they have seen the Kingdom made clear in the midst of your church/community. Where have they seen reconciliation and unity? Where have they seen Christ-like service? Where have they found assurance that the Holy Spirit is in fact moving in their midst?

Invite these congregants to write a brief statement that paints such a picture of these dreams of community. Then have each congregant share what they have written — what they imagine — in worship. As the minister in service to this particular community, you may wish to offer the final dream in a way that affirms the Holy Spirit's work in your midst and encourages the congregation boldly to trust in the Spirit's power and guidance for the future.

Each of these offerings may be punctuated with a brief sung refrain
