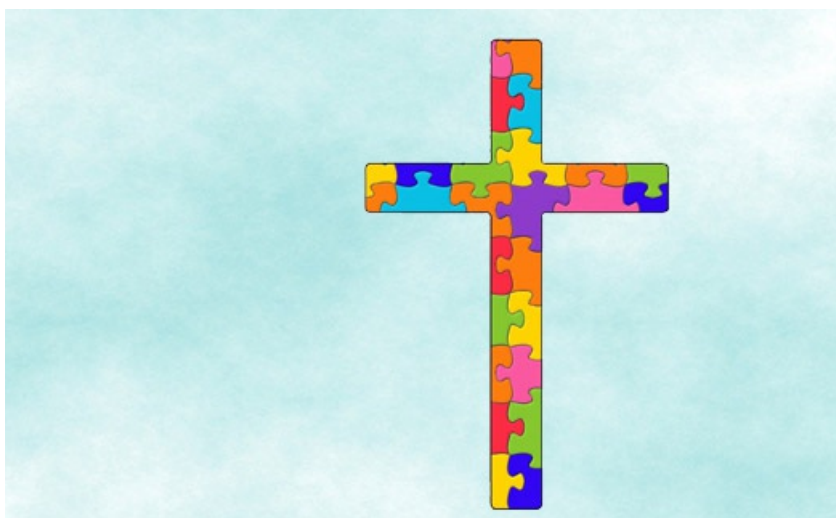

Local congregations desire to be welcoming and inviting to all of God's children, and attempt to meet that challenge by creating ministries to meet those needs. However, far too often individuals who are on the Autistic spectrum are looked at as being sub-human, as being different, and/or unable to grasp the concept of God. Scripture tells us in Matthew 4:4 "Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God". Maslow was precise in identifying the basic needs, but man has a basic need for God above all else. Man's self-actualization is becoming like Christ. Autistic children deserve the chance to develop a relationship with God as well, but churches must be willing to become more inviting. This workshop will aid churches in this challenge by giving a basic understanding of the disorder, as well as helpful hints

and assistance with designing a basic framework of a ministry that can reach out to and eventually include these amazing individuals into the life of the church.
