
Pittsburgh Theological Seminary has long been dedicated to educating and equipping the next generation of pastors and faith leaders with outstanding academic and formative experiences

COMMITMENT TO THE NEXT GENERATION OF PASTORS AND FAITH LEADERS

There is an immense need for practically-trained, theologically-minded leaders in our world. Accordingly, it is our steadfast commitment to ensure that the PTS experience is a possibility for all, regardless of one's economic reality. To do this, we provide extensive financial aid opportunities and individualized support to ensure students can confidently navigate the process and feel prepared to pursue their investment in a seminary education.

PTS FINANCIAL AID PHILOSOPHY

We do not believe that finances should be the key determinant in whether one pursues theological studies. Instead, we help remove financial barriers when and if they arise. We also do not believe that students should be required to take on substantial educational debt in order to pursue their theological education. Therefore, educational loans are a *last* resort for our students.



Only 24 percent of the 2023-2024 graduating class took out an educational loan at PTS.

- At the master's level, 87 percent of our students received financial aid.
- 50 percent of our master's students receive a living stipend from the Seminary.
- At the doctor of ministry level, 60 percent of our students received financial aid.
- Eligible doctor of ministry students can receive funds to assist with travel and lodging expenses.
